

The Expendables Release New Album "Prove It"

Los Angeles, CA, United States (AHN) - Santa Cruz, CA rockers The Expendables released their fifth album this week, "Prove It." Their second release on Slightly Stoopid's own Stoopid Records, "Prove It" is their first new album since 2007's self-titled effort.

The 17 new tracks were produced by Paul Leary, guitarist for Butthole Surfers, and El Hefe of NOFX, and feature guest spots from G. Love of G. Love and the Special Sauce and members of Slightly Stoopid.

"As producers, Leary and El Hefe brought a vibe to the studio as only two punk rock guitar legends could," the band said of the new album. "As musicians who really care about the music, we all connected and feel like we are bringing something new to the table, while still staying true to the sounds that make us who we are."

"Prove It" features one of their most melodic tracks yet in "Come Get High," which was appropriately featured as a free download on 4/20. The slow-burning album track "Wells" is currently a free download on iTunes.

Having toured with 311 last year, The Expendables join this year's Cauzin' Vapors...Legalize It 2010 Slightly Stoopid Summer Tour. Beginning in June, they'll perform alongside Slightly Stoopid and Steel Pulse.

"Prove It" is already in stores and available on digital download stores. iTunes also features two exclusive bonus tracks, "One Drop" and an acoustic version of "Wells."
